

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

1. RULES

Unless otherwise noted, the General Conditions of Competition and the Rules of Golf shall be used throughout this event. The Event Committee has sole management and control of the event.

2. COMPETITION ENTRIES

The Mt Coolum Junior Open will be played over 18 holes. The competition is open all junior amateur players under the age of 18 (as at the day of competition) who possess a current Golf Australia handicap. The player shall be a financial member of a Golf Australia affiliated club.

Entry is by nomination form (available on the MCGC website) or by calling the MCGC office. A draw for tee timeslots will be carried out in the week prior to the event. The draw will be posted on the MCGC website. The competition fee is payable prior to the start of the round. Entries will be accepted on the day of play if tee times are available,

3. GRADES

The player's handicap as at the start of play will determine the grade in which the player shall compete. The maximum handicaps – boys: 36 and girls: 45. The field will be graded as follows:

Junior Boys Division 1	0 – 9
Junior Boys Division 2	10 – 18
Junior Boys Division 3	19 – 36
Junior Girls Division	0 – 45.

All of the above divisions will play a Single Stroke event.

A 9 Hole stroke event for novice players will also be played in conjunction with the Junior Open.

Note: The Event Committee may alter the grades at any time prior to the event according to the entries received.

4. TROPHIES AND PRIZES

The following major trophies will be awarded:

Mt Coolum Junior Open Champion	Best Gross Score (Male or Female)
Mt Coolum Junior Open – Best Nett	Best Nett Score (Male or Female)
Best Gross	Best Gross score in each division.
Best Nett	Best Nett score is in each division.
9 Hole Gross	Best Gross score for 9 hole players.

The same player may win only one Major prize. If necessary, the prize will be awarded to the player with the next best score.

Other Prizes:

Nearest The Pins	Holes 5, 8, 10, 12, 14, and 16 – all grades.
Longest Drive	Hole 11 – Male and Female.

There will also be a "Ball Rundown" as determined by the Event Committee.

5. TIES

In the event of a tie or ties, the trophies will be decided by the Australian Countback System.

6. PROTESTS

Protests must be lodged in writing with the Event Committee no later than 15 minutes after the conclusion of the day's play. The decision of the Committee shall be final in all matters relating to the event.

7. ETIQUETTE

The use of mobile phones by players and/or caddies during play is prohibited. Junior players are prohibited from smoking and the consumption of alcohol. Penalty: Disqualification.

8. USE OF MOTORISED TRANSPORT

A player shall NOT ride in/on a motorised vehicle during this competition without a current medical certificate AND prior written approval from the Match Committee.
