

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION

1. RULES

Unless otherwise noted, the General Conditions of Competition and the Rules of Golf shall be used throughout this event. The Event Committee has sole management and control of the event.

2. COMPETITION ENTRIES

The Sunshine Coast Men's Masters Open will be played over 18 holes of Single Stroke and is open to Male amateur players over 50 years of age (as at the date of competition) who are members of a golf club affiliated through their district association with the relevant state body and Golf Australia. The player shall possess a current Golf Australia handicap.

Tee timeslots are offered using a Competition timesheet. The competition fee, which includes entry into the Mt Coolum Men's Open, is payable prior to the start of the round. Entries will be accepted on the day of play if tee times are available.

To be eligible, players must write their name on the Masters Open Nomination Sheet in the Pro Shop prior to starting their round. They will then be issued with a scorecard with a large "M" in the top right corner to assist the Event Committee.

3. GRADES

All Masters competitors shall compete in one grade.

Note: The Event Committee may introduce grades at any time prior to the event according to the entries received.

4. MAJOR TROPHIES

The following major trophies will be awarded:

Sunshine Coast Men's Masters Open Champion	Best Gross
Sunshine Coast Masters Open Nett Winner	Best Nett

The same player shall NOT be awarded both major Masters Event prizes. If necessary, the prize for Best Nett will be awarded to the player with the next best nett score.

NOTE: The same player may win the Mt Coolum Open and the Men's Masters Open.

5. OTHER PRIZES

Depending on the number of competitors, prizes may also be awarded for the following categories:
Masters Open Nett Score Placegetters 2nd and 3rd.

Nearest The Pin and other prizes will be awarded in conjunction with the Mount Coolum Men's Open.

6. TIES

In the event of a tie or ties, the trophies will be decided by the Australian Countback System.

7. PROTESTS

Protests must be lodged in writing with the Event Committee no later than 15 minutes after the conclusion of the player's round. The decision of the Committee shall be final in all matters relating to the event.

8. USE OF MOTORISED TRANSPORT

Gross Event	Players may use motorised transport.
Nett Event	Players may use motorised transport.
